The excitement around the sixth series of The Masked Singer UK on ITV continues unabated with audiences eager to deduce who lurks behind the costumes of the latest cavalcade of characters.Already four well-known figures have been revealed. Spag Bol was none other than Good Morning Britain's Kate Garraway, while Pegasus turned out to be television chef and Bake Off judge Prue Leith during the show's first installment.The revelations didn't stop there, however, with 'I Try' singer Macy Gray and T'Pau's Carol Decker being unmasked as Toad in the Hole and Tattoo, respectively.Now, only eight secretive personas remain. As we anticipate their inaugural group performance on Saturday (January 25), let's revisit all the hints and fan theories that have surfaced until now, reports the Mirror.Bear has showcased dynamic vocal range spanning musical theatre and rap(Image: (Image: ITV)Week 1 saw a rendition of 'You've Got to Pick a Pocket or Two' from Oliver! followed by a change in tune to 'Miami' by Will Smith for Week 2, showcasing Bear's dynamic vocal range spanning musical theatre and rap.Hints heavily laden with stage and West End innuendos point towards someone with a significant theatrical background. Additionally, football and comedy are topics woven into their visual teasers.Speculations are rampant, throwing up names like Patrick Stewart, Tom Davis, David Harewood, Example, Doc Brown, and Richard Blackwood into the speculative fray.Blackwood himself added mystery to the mix, responding ambiguously to the speculation on Good Morning Britain on Tuesday (January 21), stating: "That's how I'd do it if I was to do it."The EastEnders star also hinted that Bear's charismatic "swagger" might be the reason he's a suspect, adding that the costume is "it's hot" but hastily clarified with a cheeky "So I've heard." The character also mentioned that their work has "lit up" the UK.Speculation surrounds the identities of these contestants, with fans eager to uncover who's behind the elaborate costumes. Dressed Crab towers over host Joel Dommett, who stands at 5ft 11 inches, indicating that the celebrity behind the mask is quite tall.Fans have since speculated that it could be former NFL player and Brooklyn 99 actor Terry Crews."Terry Crews played in the NFL, the crab is absolutely massive and it also sounds exactly like Terry Crews," one viewer shared on X.Several other performers are also being considered, with The Weekend, Jamie Foxx, Billy Porter and Gregory Porter mentioned by the judges.Kingfisher has been charming us with their soothing voice(Image: TV)Songs performed:Week 1: 'The Rainbow Connection' from The Muppet MovieWeek 2: 'Iris' by The Goo Goo DollsOver the past few weeks, Kingfisher has been charming us with their soothing voice. They "enjoy" the great outdoors, have won awards and have showcased their "chorus from time to time".Harry Hill was one of the first names suggested, as his voice bears a striking resemblance to Kingfisher's. However, one of the clues featured the name 'Harry' on a tag attached to a wagon wheel. Would the show be so bold as to include the celebrity's name in the VT?Other suggestions include Paul Whitehouse, Alan Titchmarsh, Chris Packham and Bob Mortimer.Fans have also taken to Reddit to assert they "knew" who the celebrity was, despite the clues not aligning: "Whilst the clues don't add up, if you listen to Simon Farnaby's voice, and then Kingfisher's, it's so obvious that it's Simon Farnaby!"Pufferfish's standout vocals point towards the entertainment industry(Image: ITV)Songs performed:Week 1: 'Good Luck, Babe!' by Chappell RoanWeek 2's performance of 'Girls Just Want to Have Fun' by Cyndi Lauper has left many convinced that Pufferfish, with their standout vocals, must hail from the entertainment industry.The clues suggest this star has rubbed shoulders with some "fantastic" celebrities, is quick on the uptake, and is definitely not a "one-hit wonder".Despite guesses from the judges that include American celebrities like Hayden Panettiere, Gwen Stefani, Nicole Richie, and Lea Michele, the accent may be misleading - Pufferfish might just be a local talent.Musical theatre enthusiasts are "100% sure" Samantha Barks is the one singing beneath the Pufferfish disguise. Her signature voice seems to fit Pufferfish's range perfectly, and the hints seem to confirm their suspicions.One eagle-eyed fan exclaimed on X, "Finally got Pufferfish - it's Samantha Barks!" They pointed out her connections to Anita Dobson (Angie Watts) in a film and another titled Jack and the Cuckoo-Clock Heart. Plus, they noted the boots match the colour she wore on I'd Do Anything.Barks is known for her extraordinary performances. Is it possible that the West End sensation is the face behind Pufferfish's mask? They were followed by Pufferfish, Bush, Wolf, Pegasus, Toad in the Hole and Bear during Sunday's episode (January 5).Host Joel Dommett was joined by judges Mo Gilligan, Davina McCall, Jonathan Ross and Rita Ora's replacement Maya Jama, who all attempted to work out which celebrity was behind the disguise using a number of clues.Spag Bowl was revealed as broadcaster Kate Garraway during the show's launch, while Great British Bake Off star Dame Prue Leith was behind the mask of Pegasus.But which stars are behind the other masks? Here, Express Online takes a look at the different possibilities.TeethTeeth belted out their own rendition of Amarillo by Tony Christie during their first performance (Image: ITV)Teeth gave a thrilling first performance of Amarillo by Tony Christie and divided the panel over which person was tucked away behind the giant dentures.The character gave several hints about their identity, saying: "Wind me up and watch me go. I just can't stop! You can probably tell I'm a bit of a big mouth", adding: "Lads, lads, lads."Teeth also said they were trying not to put their big foot in it and confessed to biting off more than they could chew.Binoculars were included in their VT and their riddle was: "I've been schooled in variety, I have lots in the mix, the way I perform knocks the audience for six."Those tipped to be behind the mask are This Morning star Rylan Clark, comedian Rob Beckett and footballer Alan Shearer and Alan Carr. Former England footballer Alex Scott was mentioned alongside boxer Nicola Adams.SnailSome believe Cheryl is behind the Snail mask (Image: ITV)Belting out Espresso by Sabrina Carpenter, Snail left the judges torn about their identity.They were convinced that several items in the VT, including a Welcome Home tag, an old school uniform, and a Hill Dresses CrabDressed Crab is the panel's scribble about who's behind the mask (Image: ITV)Dressed Crab belted out their own rendition of Loan Me, which left the panel scratching their heads about who is behind the mask.Hinting at who they are, the clue also said: "Welcome to the world darling, you like my aesthetic? I'm going for crab, dressed crab, it's a look that never goes out of fashion. Good style can make anyone feel like a somebody."The character continued: "Just marvel at some of my creations, my work has lit up the UK."But I'm not just about the material things in life. I've scuttled all over the blue planet and now I'm here on The Masked Singer stage, ready to crab hold of the competition with both incisors."An American football helmet, gold coins, film roll and an NDA contract featured in Dressed Crab's VT.Billie Porter, Jamie Foxx, The Weekend, Tom Daley, Gregory Porter were all amongst guesses.PufferfishWho is behind the Pufferfish mask? (Image: ITV)During the second episode, Pufferfish performed Chappell Roan's tune Good Luck, Babe!.Hints included a pair of dice that landed on a five and six, an American football, a rubber spider on a hairbrush and the line "The Empire State is just too hard to miss out on."Pufferfish added: "I'm a speedy learner and it runs in the family too" alongside their riddle: "Being puffed up all day can feel so excessive, sometimes being small is just as impressive."The judges believe Pufferfish is someone that has a musical background as guesses included Britney Spears' younger sister Jamie-Lynn Spears, singer Alicia Keys, TV personality Kelly Osbourne and Loose Women star Stacey Solomon.BushBush performed Wake Up Boo by The Boo Radleys (Image: ITV)Bush made their debut during Sunday's episode and performed Wake Up Boo by The Boo Radleys.Bush dropped several clues ahead of their first appearance, revealing they are determined to show they aren't a "coward" and they like the outdoors and gardening.Bush also hinted at "stage manage" where the plants go and holds a "Best Show" trophy.The character also shared the riddle: "I've been training for years, and there's a turning back."Guest judge Vicki McClure suggested former Ground Force host Charlie Dimmock is behind the mask, while others suggested it could be Billie Piper or Stacey Solomon.Meanwhile, fans believed EastEnders star Natalie Cassidy is disguised as Bush.WolfWolf's VT featured a bishop and imagery of multi-coloured bowling pins and a ball.(Image: ITV)Fans have been speculating who is behind the mask of Wolf since they performed the David Bowie hit Let's Dance. A number of clues about Wolf's identity have been given, including a T-shirt with "Wolf Pack" written on it, mentions of "good foundations" keeping a roof over your head.Featured in the VT was a bishop and imagery of multi-coloured bowling pins and a ball.Sharing another hint, Wolf said: "You wanna know more about little old me, if the three little pigs had listened to my advice no huffing or puffing would've blown those houses down."Their riddle was: "As a wolf, I've held dominion over everything I see, wild woods, creek or cave, that's my territory."Maya guessed Wolf's identity as Location, Location, Location host Phil Spencer, while Jonathan shared three big names; actor David Tennant, Neighbours star Jason Donovan, and musician Paul Weller.Many fans believed Wet Wet Wet frontman Marti Pellow is behind the disguise, while others thought it could be Martin Fry. Toad in the HoleToad in the Hole sang a rendition of the Amy Winehouse hit Valerie (Image: ITV)Toad in the Hole sang a rendition of Amy Winehouse's Valerie, with the judges complementing their "beautiful voice". Although they could agree on Toad's stellar performance, they didn't share the same opinions of who was behind the elaborate disguise.Toad quipped: "Plenty of me to go around. I'm very versatile and I'm ready to show everyone on The Masked Singer. Always wanted to write my own destiny."The word "sizzle" was shown in their VT, while their riddle was: "Sometimes there are masses of people to feed, so I've got extra help, my priority is speed."Guesses included Olympic gold medalist Jessica Ennis-Hill, ex-radio 1 DJ Annie Mac and American R&B and soul singer Macy Gray, who appeared on The Masked Singer US in 2023.BearCould Gordon Ramsay be hiding behind the Bear mask? (Image: ITV)Wearing an incredible disguise, Bear sang a cover of 'You've Got to Pick a Pocket or Two' from the musical Oliver!The character immediately hinted at a background in theatre, with several references to performing and good luck wishes included in their VTs like a horseshoe and "break a leg" sign.Bear quipped: "The stage is set, the audience awaits, and I am hungry for the competition" before revealing they were in the West End as a "cub".A number of globes featured in their VT as well as a coffee cup.Their riddle was: "I'm walking the stage and displaying my toil, but I'm also at home amongst flowers and soil."Bear made a point of saying they hoped to "avoid a comedy of errors", prompting Mo to suggest comedian Tom Davis. Star Trek actor Patrick Stewart's name was also thrown into the ring, while others speculated that it could be TV chef Gordon Ramsay. Other suggestions included I'm A Celebrity winner Christopher Biggins and Gardeners' World host Monty Don.
