Founded by Charlie and Anna Mae Naylor in Lombard, Illinois, Naylor Candies has been churning out handmade treats for 75 years. The Fox-Cross Candy Company dreamed up the confection in 1925 and named it after a popular dance at the time called the Charleston popsicle (though it's also been referred to as the "Charleston Crack"). People have also been known to freeze their Chews for a cooler bite, crumblier consistency, and intensified nougat flavor. Roses Brands is a pioneer in the world of rock candy. The difference becomes clear once you dig into the brand's assorted bag of flavors. I would opt for a full ribbon of chocolate coconut if I could, but the vanilla and strawberry do have their own unique appeal. The rocking chairs on their front porches set the tone with an invitation to sit and stay awhile. Palmer is actually one of the oldest candy companies in the United States, with an inception dating back to 1878. The concept obviously stuck because the legend is still around today, and it grew his family with the joyful delivery of Sugar Babies in 1935. Whatever her origin may be, Mary has been a part of our lives for over 110 years. Horehound is an herb that imbues the candy with a flavor similar to black licorice, although with a bit of mintiness. Cracker Barrel sends us back in time and into The Bazookaverse with the brand's Bubble Gum Pops. After popping one of the strawberry-inspired confections into my mouth, I was immediately transported back to simpler, slower days thanks to the sucking candy's strawberry yogurt-like appeal. Kids of the '60s and '70s will remember the novelty of popping one microscopic square into their mouth at a time, or just going for it with a handful of about 20 — an amount that would still hardly give you a full wad of chewing gum. Second, as their name suggests, they come in swirled flavors of fruit mixed with cream. It admittedly takes quite a few licks to reach this mysterious center. While MoonPies were invented to give coal miners a filling snack on their breaks, they're a mainstay, especially around the holidays. Find the Fruit Gems — the modern version of Fun Fruits made by a more current manufacturer — on the shelves at Cracker Barrel. Conversely, Cow Tales come in a longer, stick-like shape, though they contain the same milky interior to allow for maximum caramel cream snacking. Miller named the brand after his favorite aunt. You'll largely only find Gilliam in specialty shops and seasonal storefronts and in limited quantities where it's available at big box stores. Was your Dubble Bubble blowing the best on the block? They market their candy on nostalgia, and their Old Fashioned Blue Ribbon Neopolitan Coconut Slice Candy Bars are available at Cracker Barrel for only \$1.99. Each one offers its own unique flavor profile including chocolate, wintergreen, lemon, lime, clove, cinnamon, orange, and licorice. First off, they're missing that iconic hole in the middle, turning them into a disc with a center dimple instead of a ring shape. A nonpareil is a flat, disc-shaped chocolate candy embellished with round sprinkles. Cracker Barrel embraces a similar vintage aesthetic, but Cow Tales aren't the only novelty candy the restaurant chain carries. However, the candied crust comes in cherry, grape, and green apple, all with tastes similar to those found in Jolly Rancher bags. Made up of mostly chewy milk caramel, the bits take after their father. But if you're looking for an addition to your collection or want to check out what PEZ is still releasing, Cracker Barrel is a reliable location to find several options for this candy that doubles as a toy. At Cracker Barrel, Naylor's claim to fame can be found in several different pastel colors including pink, green, and yellow. Just like Blow Pops, these suckers hide a surprise at their core. Known best for hard, butter-flavored candy, they've since expanded into a variety of filled candies, soft caramels, chewy caramels, and flavored popcorn. We're all for a candy and a toy all wrapped into one-whoever said not to play with your food simply wasn't thinking creatively enough. Sure enough, the flavors coincide with each color giving you tastes of chocolate coconut, vanilla coconut, and strawberry coconut all wrapped into one. In addition to the classic recipe, Cow Tales also come in a variety of other flavors, including apple, Oreo cookie, brownie, and smoothie. Based in Sioux City, Iowa, the business got its start selling penny candy, hand-dipped boxed chocolates, gumdrops, and marshmallows. The word "nonpareil" also means an unrivaled or matchless person or thing (aka the creme de la creme). The flavor is bold and juicy, and I'll never understand how they're able to infuse so much creaminess into each piece. As for soft candies, coconut slices are a unique treat that combines chocolate, vanilla, and strawberry flavors. Both Sugar Babies and Sugar Daddy treats can be found at Cracker Barrel. At one time, there was also such a thing as a Sugar Mama chocolate-covered caramel sucker. These aren't just meant for freshening your breath, either. The bar stands out thanks to its larger-than-life size, coming in at about twice the length of your standard Snickers or Butterfinger. You'll notice the trio of colors painted onto the bendable bars — brown, white, and pink just like a strip of Neapolitan ice cream. Of course, different flavors are applied to each wand, creating a wonderful rainbow of dazzling colors. All three start out rather tough as you bite into the outer milk chocolate — "Chew' was definitely an appropriate choice. The endless assortment of flavors is what makes the gummy candy appealing to both kids and adults alike, and one of the best, most long-standing names in the business happens to be Sweet's. But in these poppable pillows, they go together like peanut butter and jelly or cheese and wine. But she was discontinued in the 1980s, leaving Dad and his offspring to fend for themselves. And boy is the peanut butter prominent. That is before they were all stripped from shelves in 2011. By 1952, the brand was sweeping the United States, and in 1958, the first licensed character, Popeye, appeared on a PEZ dispenser. Now, it is very rare to see the NECCO brand out and about. Werther's Original is still pretty popular in Europe and North America but much less widely found than in the 1990s. WWI led to shortages of essential chewing gum ingredients, which inspired the confectioners to experiment with other types of treats, including its famous caramel confections. Sometimes referred to by past names like Tiny Chiclets or Chicles Mini Fruit Gum, the treat is a major sugary blast from the past that resurfaced in 2022. Also, instead of boasting nuts, caramel, crisped rice, or wafers, it features a sticky nougat in flavors of vanilla, chocolate, and strawberry. But you will always find it at the Cracker Barrel country store's cash wrap. The business has occupied the same manufacturing plant since 1928, although modifications ensure it can keep up with customer demand. We're talking about nostalgic treats that haven't touched your taste buds in years — the ones you can't pick up at any ol' gas station or Walmart. Visiting a Cracker Barrel is like taking a step back in time thanks to the quaint decor and down-home menu selection. However, PEZ's flavor isn't as bold as other candies, and the brand has been less popular recently. The one found at Cracker Barrel offers a total of 10 unique tastes with a little something for everyone. The oldest candy brand in Cracker Barrel's arsenal has to be the Necco. Digging one of these out of your grandma's candy bowl was like striking gold. It's a chocolate-covered marshmallow wafer sandwich that has been delights have stood the test of time as a fan favorite, and large Smarties are available for less than \$2 at Cracker Barrel. Instead of pulling it — as many other candy makers do — Sweet's whips its taffy, making for a product that's softer and less sticky. They even have the texture of real coconut shreds. They'll most likely have several sizes and variations. They restaurant chain also features a variety of classic sweet treats in its general store, including one staple of a bygone era. However, these mints are also beloved for their texture, which can be described as buttery smooth as they dissolve. It's our impression that candy corn is carried in country stores year-round, with the Mellowcreme Autumn mix being available for extended periods. While you won't see Werther's Original everywhere, you can spot a few of their products in Cracker Barrel's Country Store. Nab it for an affordable price any day between 7 a.m. and 9 p.m. local time. On the packaging, it claims to be the "World's Largest Crystal Wand," but I'm not so sure about that — I think there may be larger ones hiding somewhere out there. As for the taste, it's mostly pure sugar, though I also noticed the distinctive flavor of blue raspberry cotton candy. Hard candies and legacy brands are a-plenty. If you haven't picked one up by now, just know that you have to really like the tropical fruit to enjoy a slice. The gum flavor itself remains the same from pop to pop. Now, butter and mint are two ingredients you typically don't see saddled up to one another — they don't seem like they would be complementary. There's no other candy quite like a Charleston Chew. Founded in 1949, a man from a British candy-making family used a repurposed pellet-making machine from World War II to make the candy in a garage in New Jersey. You would be somewhat correct. Mary Jane is a retro candy that elicits many questions. Born in the 1920s, the candy icon is best described as a caramel brick on a stick — a simple yet indulgent sticky sucker featuring nothing else but slow-cooked caramel. But they also have a unique bite to them that hasn't changed in the past 170 years. At the same time, though, its young mascot bears an uncanny resemblance to a certain Buster Brown comic strip character by the same name. Guests gobble down a heaping plate of down-home Southern-style cuisine at a wooden table just like the one you would find at grandma's house. Cow Tales, a product of Goetze's Candy Company, first appeared on store shelves in 1984. At Roses, the hard sugar candy comes on a stick like a lollipop, and the company calls them "crystal wands" (an extremely accurate description if you ask us). Originally released by Nabisco, Creme Savers are cousins of Life Savers but with a few key differences. The spelling also refers to the famous nursery rhyme "Hey Diddle, Diddle" from Mother Goose. Beyond their intended use as a sweet snack, Necco wafers are also known for being a great gingerbread house decoration, the perfect poker chip substitute, or even accepted currency at a child's play store. Without further context, you may assume the sweet treat is a product of Charleston, South Carolina. But they're also swathed in a sugary outer layer that gives them a taste similar to candy corn. Some even say that the aunt story was just a ruse to avoid a lawsuit or other legal ramifications from the comic's creators. Coincidence? Courtesy of Cracker Barrel Price: \$4.99 I rarely notice an abundance of Brach's in the aisles of local stores unless I happen to be at CVS the day after Halloween and candy corn is on sale. But at the old country store, another throwback option sits on the shelf: Candy Farm's Neapolitan Coconut Slices. And, believe it or not, that's just the half of it. He sold the company to Quality Candy in 1944. Nonpareils come from many different sources. The candy is an offshoot of the brand's beloved Bulls-Eyes which consist of bite-sized pieces of caramel with a sweet cream center. Introduced in 1894 (as disclosed on the wrapper), the candy relic has been putting a tropical twist on dessert time for generations. Courtesy of Cracker Barrel Price: \$7.99 In the 1980s, you couldn't go anywhere without Sunkist Fun Fruits surrounding you. Besides Cow Tales, the Cracker Barrel website features a wide selection of retro and nostalgic candy of every description, including hard candies in surprising flavors. And did she really resemble the little brown-haired, doe-eyed girl on the wrappers? The taste and texture combination is almost similar to a decadent frosting. On the fruity side, there's banana, blue raspberry, pear, orange vanilla, and wildberry. In their heyday, Strawberries & Creme, Orange & Creme, Creme, and even Chocolate & Caramel Creme flavors were available. The confectionery has been whipping up its salt water taffy since 1910 — and we mean whipping in a literal sense. Originally invented in the 1880s in Atlantic City, New Jersey, saltwater taffy (the name may have started as a joke) has been a treasured staple along the coasts for as long as any of us can remember. The white pieces take on a sugar-free peppermint flavor, and they look just like mini versions of Eclipse gum that you pop out of the foil. Small candy with a big history, that's MiniMini Chicles for you. However, instead of caramel at its base, it's actually a combination of both molasses and peanut butter. But the ones stocked at Cracker Barrel are compliments of Palmer Candy Company — a manufacturer that flies under the radar considering I had to resort to the fine print on the back of the bag to find the name.

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
